HOW DO I BECOME A

PSYCHOLOGICAL ASSOCIATE?

- 1. Complete an undergraduate degree in Psychology (or equivalent).
 - To explore how your Seneca diploma may pathway into this degree, please review the Degree Transfer Guide.
- Complete a Master's Degree in Psychology.
- 3. Register with the College of Psychologists of Ontario for a Supervised Practice certificate.
 - Complete at least 6,000 hours of formal supervised experience.
 - Pass the Examination for Professional Practice in Psychology (EPPP) within one year of receiving certificate.
- 4. Register with the College of Psychologists of Ontario for an Autonomous Practice certificate.
 - Pass the College of Psychologists of Ontario's Jurisprudence and Ethics Examination (JEE).
 - Pass the College of Psychologists of Ontario's Oral Examination.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR MASTER'S DEGREE IN PSYCHOLOGY

Requirements vary by institution. Common requirements:

- > Undergraduate degree (Honours) in Psychology or equivalent Some institutions require a certain number of courses/specific courses in Psychology (e.g., Statistics) and/or the completion of an undergraduate thesis.
- > Competitive GPA (usually 3.7 (A- or 80%) or higher)

 Note: Minimum GPA requirements vary, and most applicants have GPAs that are significantly higher than the minimum.
- > General Graduate Record Examination (GRE) scores.
- > Statement of Interest / Statement of Intent / Personal Essay
- > Letter(s) of Recommendation (typically 2-3 academic).
- > Resume/Curriculum Vitae (CV)
- > Admissions Interview.

Meeting the minimum requirements does not guarantee admission.
